

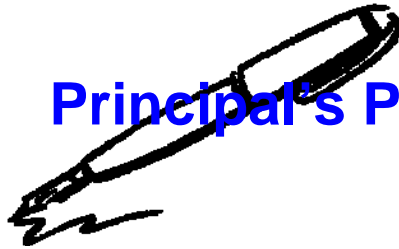

Nurse's Corner

Hello Beaty Families,

March 16th – 20th is Poison Prevention Week. Thousands of children are accidentally poisoned each year. According to www.poisonprevention.org:

"More than 2 million poisonings are reported each year to the 61 Poison Control Centers (PCCs) across the country. More than 90 percent of these poisonings occur in the home. The majority of non-fatal poisonings occur in children younger than six years old. And, poisonings are one of the leading causes of death among adults.

Young children are curious and use their home environment as a classroom – a place to learn and explore. Exploring for younger children is often done by mouthing objects which puts them at greater risk of unintentional poisonings. For young children who are unable to read, a bottle of orange-scented household cleaner may be mistaken for orange juice; the medicine in the ill container can look a lot like small candies; and baby oil, which can be deadly if ingested, can resemble a clear drink."

Below are some prevention tips from the "Texas Center Poison Network". This is only a partial list. For a complete list please visit www.poisoncontrol.org and click on "Prevention".

GENERAL STORAGE

- Store sprays, fingernail solutions, hair care products, mouthwash, perfumes, cosmetics, powders, sachets, etc, out of reach of children.
- Anticipate your child's curiosity and skills. Remove household products such as detergents and drain cleaners from under the sink.
- Never transfer products like bleach, gasoline, insecticides or other cleaning agents to containers such as a soft drink bottle, cup or bowl that would attract a child or pet.
- Keep alcoholic beverages out of reach of children.

KITCHEN

- Never store food and household cleaners together.
- Avoid keeping medicines on counter tops or easy to reach areas.
- Do not store medicines in the refrigerator door. Put them out of sight of children
- Anticipate your child's curiosity and skills. If you have a crawling infant, keep household products stored above the floor level, not beneath the kitchen sink.

BATHROOM

- Do not take medicines in front of your child. Children love to imitate their parents.
- Never call medicine "candy."
- Never give medicine in the dark.
- If you are interrupted while using a medicine or household product, take it or the child with you. It only takes a few seconds for your child to get into it.
- Store medicines, sprays, fingernail solutions, hair-care products, cosmetics, mouthwash, etc, out of reach.

BEDROOM

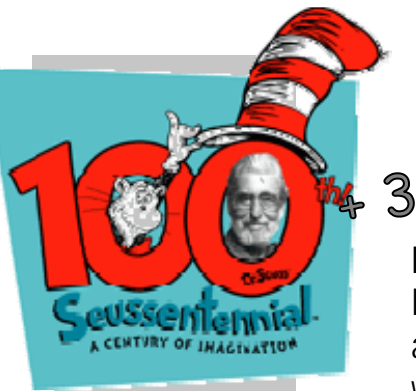
- Avoid keeping medicines in or on bedside tables.
- Keep perfumes, cosmetics, powders and sachets out of reach.

Always keep the number for "Poison Control" near your phone. It is 1-800-222-1222. Included in your go pack this week is a magnet with this number on it for you to place on your refrigerator. The minutes saved by having this number handy could make a difference if an accidental poisoning occurs in your home.

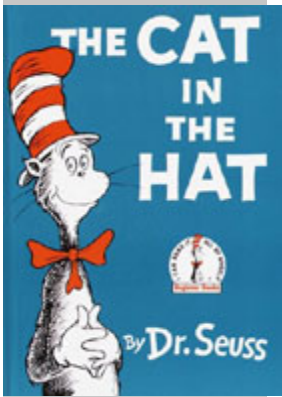

In the Library...

Happy Birthday Dr. Seuss! (March 2) We will celebrate the 104th birthday of Dr. Seuss by having a "Seuss-a-bration" on March 12. The "Cat in the Hat" and "Sam I Am" will present Green Eggs and Ham. In his book, I Can Read with My Eyes Shut, Dr. Seuss offers these words of wisdom:

"The more that you read,
the more things you will know.
the more that you learn,
the more places you'll go."



The students are learning what Dr. Seuss did as an *author* and *illustrator*. He wanted to write books for children that were fun to read. Thus, he promoted a love of reading through his rhyming text and comical illustrations. We will practice the rhyming words while reading his book, Hop on Pop.

When we discussed bedtime activities the students enjoyed the repetitive story, What! Cried Granny, an Almost Bedtime Story. We sequenced the events in the story as Granny got Patrick ready for bed. Ask your child why Patrick never got to sleep. (Clue: It was morning before he was ready for bed.) We also sang the rhyming story of The Lady with the Alligator Purse by Nadine Westcott.

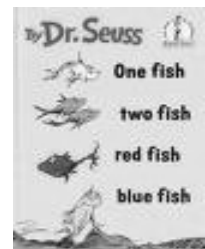

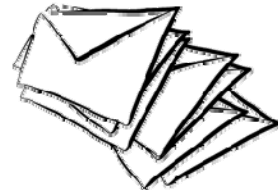

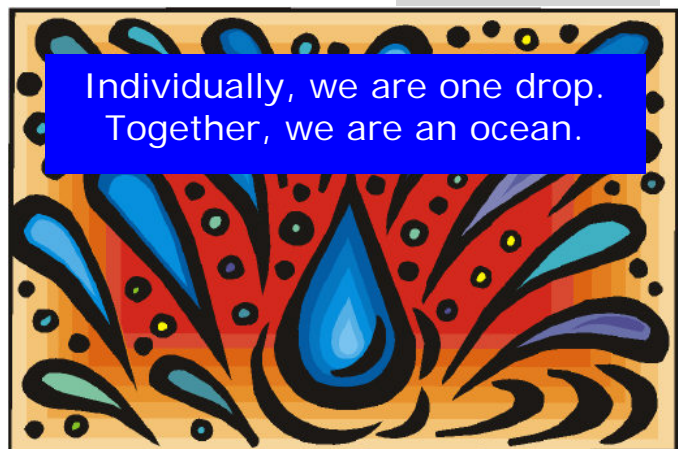

Beaty Motto for 2007 - 2008



Hello Parents:

The Parent Teacher Association (PTA) wishes to extend a special invitation to all of the parents of returning students. We are in the process of forming a Nominating Committee to nominate and elect the 2008–2009 Beaty PTA executive board members. Our board is a diverse group, made up of parents with varying backgrounds, availability, and talents. Several of our board members work outside the home and are able to assume their PTA responsibilities with minimal time commitment.

Our plan this year is to find parents interested in serving on the board early, so that you can become familiar with your position and get to know the workings of our school. With several months left in the school year, you will be able to work alongside the current board member, until you feel that you grasp the task ahead for next year.

Beaty PTA board positions range from activities mostly done from home to interacting with the school on a regular basis. Members are required to attend executive board and PTA General Meetings, which are one each per month, with the exception of December. Below is a list and brief description of all of the positions that we will fill for the 2008–2009 school year:

Elected Officers:

President: The President presides over and runs both PTA executive board and PTA General Meetings each month. This person is the representative for the Beaty PTA at school district functions/meetings and meets with school staff/principal as needed.

1st V.P. – Programs: The 1st Vice President of Programs will coordinate children's and parent's educational programs to be presented after the monthly General Meeting.

2nd V.P. –Membership: The V.P. of Membership promotes individual, staff, and corporate memberships in the PTA and runs our membership drives. Furnishing a list of members to the PTA Secretary, Treasurer, President and State by various deadlines, and issuing membership cards are the major responsibilities of this position.

3rd V.P. –Volunteers: The V.P. of Volunteers appoints and oversees neighborhood and homeroom representatives. Responsibilities include volunteer sign-up at registration, recognizing outstanding volunteers, determining staff volunteer needs, and assisting in volunteer appreciation.

4th V.P. –Ways & Means: The V.P. of Ways & Means is in charge of coordinating fundraisers to support the PTA programs for the year. This VP also serves on the budget committee, which takes all board members' input and turns it into a budget to be presented to the General Membership for approval. This position coordinates all of our fundraising efforts with the following sub-committee chairs: School Supplies,

Fall/Spring Fundraiser, Spiritwear, Grocery Store Rebates/Recycling, and Special Events (see more information on sub-committees below).

Secretary: The secretary is responsible for reminding all board members of upcoming meetings. Also, the secretary should attend all executive board and general meetings. At all meetings, the secretary is responsible for taking minutes and presenting them at the following meeting for approval.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is the chair of the budget committee, which prepares and submits a budget to the executive board and association. The incoming Treasurer serves as a member of the audit committee, reviewing the prior fiscal year's records. This person is responsible for filing quarterly sales tax forms, issuing checks for payment, and reimbursing as well as collecting items from the Treasurer's box twice weekly. Knowledge of accounting principles is a plus. Software is provided by the PTA.

Parliamentarian: The Parliamentarian is the chairman of the by-laws revision committee and provides rules of parliamentary procedure at all meetings. Knowledge of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* is helpful.

Historian: The Historian should be familiar with scrap booking techniques. The Historian is responsible for compiling a record of events and activities to be presented as the official history of the school. This person acts as custodian of all records and materials pertinent to the history of the PTA.

Standing Committee Chairmen:

Hospitality: The Hospitality Chair is responsible for organizing refreshments at general meetings and is responsible for parent coffees and picnics.

Library Coordinator: The Library Coordinator organizes and runs our annual Book Fair. This person is also responsible for assisting the Librarian with volunteer organization.

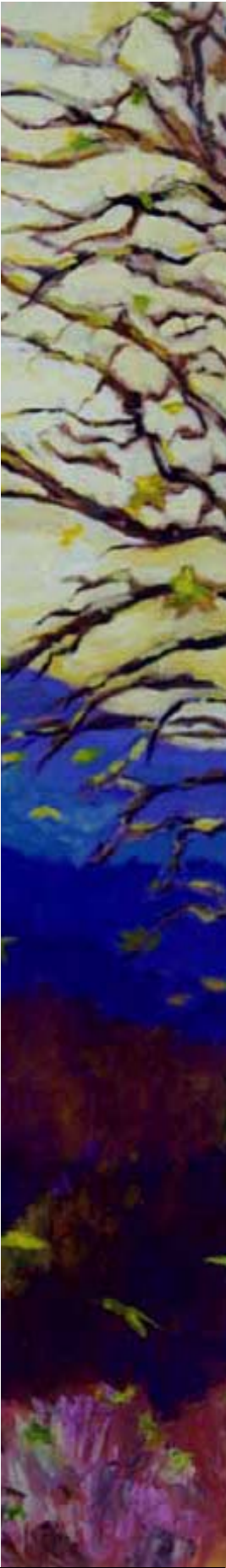
Newsletter: The Newsletter Chair is responsible for working with the PTA board and school staff to prepare and publish a monthly newsletter. Candidate should be comfortable with using software.

Directory Chairman: This person creates a student database and compiles a student directory handbook for PTA members.

Staff Appreciation: Organizes teacher appreciation week and coordinates other appreciation weeks with the sub-committees (see more information on sub-committees below).

Yearbook Coordinator: Responsibilities include overseeing the production of the school yearbook from start to finish.





Publicity/Weekly Communicator: The Weekly Communicator/Publicity chair is responsible for and coordinates the distribution of weekly communicator packets and works with the webmaster and marquee helper.

SAGE: The Special And Gifted Education (SAGE) Chair organizes Parent Network Meetings and shares information about Plano Council of PTA's SAGE programs.

Multicultural: Plans and supervises at least one whole school social function and multicultural day per year.

Last year the Beaty PTA created sub-committees for Ways and Means, Staff Appreciation and Publicity/Weekly Communicator. This has been a great experience! In addition to making all of these positions more manageable, it has allowed an opportunity for a greater number of people with different talents and ideas to take an active role on the board. This increased participation has definitely enhanced our service to Beaty and our children. We are looking to keep these sub-committees next year and are looking for sub-committee chairmen as follows:

Ways and Means Sub-Committees:

School Supplies: This person coordinates school supplies ordering, communications, sales and deliveries.

Spiritwear: This person coordinates the ordering, all communications and sales of Beaty Spiritwear.

Fall/Spring Fundraiser: This person makes arrangements with different fundraising companies, sets dates, publicizes the fall and spring fundraisers, and coordinates sales and distribution of items sold.

Grocery Store Rebates/Recycling: This person publicizes how to participate in grocery store rebates and recycling programs. He/she will also coordinate with the appropriate vendors and either ship or arrange for pick-up of ink, toner cartridges, and cell phones.

Special Events: This person will coordinate any additional fundraisers we may need such as Jumptown. He/she coordinates with the vendor and publicizes the event.

Staff Appreciation Sub-Committees:

Staff Birthdays: Will send birthday greetings to the staff.

Teacher Appreciation Corner: This person will collect appreciation letters from parents and students and select one to be printed monthly in the newsletter, "The Beaty Gazette". A certificate will be prepared from every letter received and given to the principal to present to the teacher.

Staff Appreciation Events: Organizes various staff appreciation events throughout the year such as Bus Driver Appreciation, Counselor Appreciation, and Librarian Appreciation, to name a few.

Publicity/ Weekly Communicator Sub-Committees:

Webmaster: The webmaster will maintain the PTA's website (www.beatyppta.org).

Marquee: This person will be responsible for marquee communication in conjunction with the Beaty staff.

The PTA wants to make sure that everyone has a great year and would like for parents to become involved with the school by supporting their PTA. Please contact me at 214-923-1193 if you are interested in a board position or have any questions.
